

RULES FOR SAFE OPERATION

- Know controls and how to stop quickly, READ THE OWNER'S MANUAL.

- Follow a regular schedule in maintaining, caring for, and using your Attachment.













ASSEMBLY

NOTES:

- It is recommended that you carefully read this Owner's Manual BEFORE starting assembly of the unit.
- Fold out carton to use as a pad during assembly and arrange each kind of hardware into a group to ease assembly.
- Assemble your Cart on a flat surface.
- The Lock Nut must be used where specified. It has a slightly oblong hole and is domed on one end.
- Assemble the Cart with the screw heads located on the INSIDE of bed.
- To ease assembly, use screwdriver to align flange holes
- Do not tighten Hardware until all Hardware is in place and Wagon Bed is upside down on a flat surface.
 This will insure a level cart.
- Assembly of some parts may require assistance.

TOOLS REQUIRED FOR ASSEMBLY


- 1 Large pair of pliers (slip joint recommended).
- 1 Screwdriver (flat)
- 2 Medium size adjustable wrenches or
- 1 Adjustable wrench and set of open-end wrenches
- 4 1 3/16" Allen Wrench

BED, DRAWBAR AND AXLE

Refer to Fig. 1

- Stand the bed halves (7) (with flanges touching) on end, on a smooth flat surface.
- Insert 5/16" x 1/2" Round Head screws (25) through the upper and lower holes - leave the hole in center area open.
- Secure these screws with 5/16" Hex Lock Nuts (30).
 Finger tighten.
- Install one Bed Support Angle (19) on the outside of each Bed Half Flange -lining up the center hole. Insert a 5/16" x 3/4" Round Head Screw (26) through hole and secure with a 5/16" Hex Lock Nut (30).
- Tighten this screw securely.
- Attach the Support Angle (9) (with flange up) to the bed end NOT on the ground, using ten 5/16" x 3/4" Flat Head Screws (28 -From inside bed), and secure each with one Special Flat Washer (21) and a 5/16" Hex Lock Nut (30). Do not tighten!

Note: DO NOT install fasteners in the two holes shown. See illustration "A".



- See illustration "A", Lay Cart on a flat surface.
- Attach the Axle Support Bracket (15) to the bottom of the Bed by inserting 5/16" x 3/4" Round Head Screws (26 - from inside Bed) through the two holes in each Bed Half and Bed Support Angle at center of Bed.
 Secure with 5/16" Hex Lock Nuts (30). Do not tighten!
- Place one Bed Support Angle (19) under each end of Axle Support Bracket (15) and insert 5/16" x 3/4" Round Head Screws (26 from inside Bed) through the two holes per end, then secure with 5/16" Hex Lock Nuts (30). Do not tighten!
- See illustration "B", Stand Cart up, resting on previously assembled Support Angle.
- Position one End Panel (8 with Flange facing down) inside the previously assembled Bed Halves.
- Align six holes in sides of End Panel and Bed Halves and insert 5/16" x 1/2" Round Head Screws (25 from inside Wagon Bed), securing with 5/16" Hex Lock Nuts (30). Do not tighten!
- Place two 5/16" Lock Washers (32) inside the "Dimpled" Projections in End Panel (Between Bed Halves and End Panel) and insert a 5/16" x 1" Round Head Screw (27) through these and the Bed Halves.
- Place the Lock Bracket (13 with notch forward) on these two screws
- IMPORTANT: Make sure the two 5/16" Lock Washers remain inside the Dimpled Projections.
- Secure with two 5/16" Hex Lock Nuts (30). Do not tighten!
- Align remaining holes in End Panel and Bed Halves and insert 5/16" x 1/2" Round Head Screws (25 from inside of Wagon Bed), securing with 5/16" Hex Lock Nuts (30). Do not tighten!
- Lay the Cart upside down on a flat smooth surface (to insure a level bed) and securely tighten all fasteners used in Fig. 1 and Fig. 2.

Note: It is necessary to tighten each Flat Head Screw (28) until the head is flush with the bed surface. See illustration "B", Fig. 1.

- While the Cart is upside down, lay the Drawbar (16) (with flnages up) in the Axle Support Bracket (15)
 "cut-out" and on the Lock Bracket (13). See illustration "A".
- Line up the holes in the two flanges of Drawbar with the Axle Guides formed in the Axle Support Bracket (15).
- Guide the Axle (10) through until there is an equal amount of Axle extending from both sides of Axle Support Bracket (15).

WHEELS

Refer to Fig. 3

- Install one Wheel Spacer (17) on each end of Axle, then one Axle Bushing (22), a Wheel (11, with Valve Stem facing out), and another Axle Bushing (22).
- Secure each end of the Axle with 1 "E" Ring (18) in Groove at the ends of Axle.

Note: "E" Rings can be assembled to Axle using a large pair of Pliers.





LOCK BAR

Refer to Fig. 4

- Refer to illustration "A". Assemble the Lock Bar Handle (3 - with notch rearward) to the Drawbar (16) by placing the two Handle Spacers (12) inside the Handle Spring (4) coils and on either side of the Lock Bar Handle (3).
- Slide the 3/8" x 4-1/2" Hex Head Bolt (23) through the Drawbar and parts described above.
- Secure with the 3/8" Hex Lock Nut (1) as shown.
 Note: DO NOT overtighten!! Handle must move freely with minimum side sway.
- Lift each leg of the Handle Spring (4) up and over the side of Drawbar as shown in insert "B". Note: For proper operation, the notch in the Lock Bar must engage the notch in the Lock Bracket. See illustration "C". If Lock Bar is difficult to engage into Lock Bracket, it may be necessary to push back on Lock Bracket to align with Lock Bar.



DRAWBAR CLEVIS AND PIN

Refer to Fig. 5

- Turn the Cart right side up (on its wheels).
- Assemble the Clevis (2) to the Drawbar (16) using two 5/16" x 3/4" Round Head Screws (27) and 5/16" Hex Lock Nuts (30) - tighten securely.
- Install the Drawbar Pin(34) and Hairpin Cotter (35) provided.



END PANEL (TAILGATE)

Refer to Fig. 6

- Attach each Tailgate Lock Bracket (5) to the End Panel (tailgate) (8) with two 1/4" x 1/2" Round Head Bolts (24), securing with 1/4" Hex Lock Nuts (29).
- Install the Gate Retainer Pins (6) through the "dimpled" holes in the bottom of the tailgate and secure with 5/16" Hex Lock Nuts (30).
- Tighten these fasteners and check all other fasteners on the Cart for tightness.

Note: If the Tailgate Lock Brackets (5) do not align with slots (in the bed halves), loosen the Retaining Bolts (24) and shift the Brackets for proper alignment. See illustration "A".

- Align the retainer pins with the matching holes in the Cart Bed and lower the End Panel until the Gate Lock Brackets engage the two slots on top of each side of hed
- If Logo Decal (14) is not applied to the Front panel (8), see Parts Page (8) for location.
 Your Cart is now ready for use.

OPERATION

 Connect the Dump Cart to your Tractor, using the Drawbar Pin and Hairpin Cotter provided.



WARNING!

- When backing carefully back straight to avoid jackknifing, which could result in damage to equipment.
- Always Secure the pin with the Hairpin Cotter attached to Chain before transporting your Cart.
- For ease of loading and unloading the Dump Cart, it is best to have the bed of the cart as level as possible.
- When loading the Cart, distribute the weight such that the cart is slightly tail heavy, making it easy to dump.
- When hauling loose material such as dirt, rocks, etc., lock the tailgate in with the flanges toward the rear (facing outward), otherwise, it may be difficult to remove.



WARNING!

• Braking with heavy loads: When operating with heavy materials such as wet sand, dirt, or concrete, check the ability of your tractor to stop the loaded cart while on a slight incline before attempting to brake on a steep incline. Depending upon your tractor's size and the type of brakes, a fully loaded cart may overpower your tractor.

MAINTENANCE

Note: Your Dump Cart is essentially maintenance free. However, as with any steel product, it can rust.

 For rust on bed or frame parts, sand lightly and coat with enamel.




- For rust on Axle, remove Wheels, sand lightly and apply a light coat of axle grease or heavy oil and replace Wheels.
- Periodically grease your Cart's Wheels through the grease fitting provided, with standard Axle Grease.
- Periodically check tightness of all fasteners.
- For long life, store the Cart in a dry area.
- Maintain proper tire pressure (Max. 28 P.S.I.).
